

Job Title: Head Cabin Leader (1 male & 1 female)
Job Classification: Summer Leadership Staff

Organizational Relationships:

- Directly reports to Ministry Staff
- Indirectly reports to Program Director

Position Overview:

The Head Cabin Leader is responsible for providing mentorship and supervision to the cabin leaders and junior staff. Head Cabin Leaders accomplish this by doing daily check-ins with each cabin leader, providing mentorship and guidance to junior staff members, helping to guide and mediate conflict/issues that may arise, and being the first line of defense when dealing with camper discipline. Head Cabin Leaders will also serve as the primary spiritual support for cabin leaders and junior staff.

Job Tasks:

- Develop mentoring relationships with each cabin leader through intentional one-on-ones and daily check-ins.
- Provide spiritual support to cabin leaders:
 - Pray with them daily
 - o Hold them accountable in pursuing their own relationship with God
 - o Provide insight on areas of spiritual growth
- Provide mentorship to junior staff:
 - o Check-in with them during their volunteer week
 - Encourage them in their faith
 - Provide training for duties they may be assigned
- Lead by example of what it looks like to be intentional in camping ministry.
- Help to cultivate a healthy culture within the staff that reflects the heart of Christ and his design for the body of Christ.

- Assist cabin leaders in enforcing disciplinary and safety standards according to LBBC policy.
- When not performing head cabin leading duties, assist in general program duties (including, but not limited to, food service, housekeeping, and facilities) as assigned.
- Perform Summer Leadership Staff duties in coordination with the Summer Leadership Staff team, as directed by Ministry Staff.
- All other duties as assigned.

Desired Education and/or Experience:

- One (or more) summer of cabin-leading experience.
- 2+ years of college or outside ministry experience.

Desired Knowledge, Skill, and Ability:

- Knowledge and ability to understand the physical, mental, emotional, and spiritual needs of cabin leaders and junior staff
- Knowledge and ability to lead and teach cabin leaders and junior staff spiritually
- Knowledge and ability to handle disciplinary matters calmly and confidently
- Ability to foster a positive and encouraging culture within the cabin leading staff
- Ability to effectively lead, organize, and communicate with small groups of campers
